What is the Cost?

The all-inclusive cost for the trip is \$1500. This cost includes airfare, room and board, meals while in Jamaica, ground transportation and Travel Insurance. Cost DOES NOT include passport, passport photos, meals to and from Jamaica, some meals in Jamaica, snacks, baggage fees, souvenirs.

How many people from each church can go? The trip is limited to a total of fifty participants. The trip is open to churches across the United States. Each church is asked to limit the number of participants to ten.

Why Jamaica?

The NAAF has led the Southern Baptist Convention to place a laser sharp focus on George Liele who is Jamaican. Churches in our network have partnered with the country of Jamaica for over three decades. The country of Jamaica has over 80% of their people who are far from God. Spiritual darkness prevails over the country. We have partnered over the past five years with men and women conferences. Over the past four years we have facilitated youth conferences. This mission trip will provide an opportunity for participants to be introduced to a new culture and share the love of Christ.

Who will we be working with?

The team will be working with the Bethel Baptist Circuit of churches and Pastor Denzil Jack. We will also be working with Linstead Ministers Fraternal and leadership from the Jamaica Baptist Union.

How old do you have to be to go?

In order to go to Jamaica, you need to be 15 years of age or have completed the 9th grade by May 2024. Under 15 must be accompanied by a Parent.

What types of ministry teams are needed?

- Lead devotion in Jamaica primary and high schools
- Servant evangelism projects
- Assist in leading backyard bible clubs
- Men's Conference
- Women's Conference
- Provide leadership in worship through areas of giftedness
- Preach and teach in worship services

Where will we sleep during the Mission Trip?

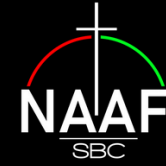
Participants will be lodging at the Island Dream Hotel, Bogwalk, Jamaica. The rooms are equipped with air conditioning, showers, toilets, sinks and other amenities. The hotel has an onsite restaurant, meeting room, Jamaica Skating rink and has a full-time security team on site.

Where will we eat our meals?

Meals will be provided at the Island Dream Hotel. The hotel restaurant will provide breakfast and lunch. There will be occasions where the team will be on the mission field during lunchtime and accommodation for lunch will be coordinated. Participants will need to have money to purchase meals while at the airport and any meal that they consume while traveling from Montego Bay to Bogwalk which is a three-hour drive.

Will I receive any training prior to going?

Yes, Prior to the trip a Virtual Orientation will be hosted in April/May. You will be notified of the specific date.
